

He talks about the **shifting powers** of a 'geo-political marketplace', referring to the dynamic where 'First World' superpowers like the US, the EU and China, compete for the influence of a '**Second World'** -- referring to such pivotal regions as the Middle East, Latin America, Central Asia, South Asia, South East Asia and Eastern Europe, where some countries will increasingly exhibit both 'First World' and 'Third World' characteristics and will engage in multi-alignment vis-à-vis the US, the EU and China.
